Tablecloths, Gorsedd Prayer, 2021

The words printed onto the tablecloths are from The Gorsedd Prayer.

The Gorsedd Prayer was written in London in the late 18th century by Iolo Morganwg who played a key role in the cultural revival of modern Wales.





There are 2 video works in this space:



Conversation Pieces (where do you carry your grief, and after grief how do you find joy?), 2021

This 3 screen video work plays on a loop with sound

Written letters are read aloud with subtitles



These informal letters read aloud are meant to be heard as slices of conversations

They are acts to explore personal + collective agency in the face of external forces +things out of our control



The projected video *The sung* interludes - Interliwdiau interrupts the screen videos at set times, fading in and out as the projector at the other end of the room clicks on with sound


The times indicate when the singing shines onto the wall opposite to the 3 screen videos

RULES OF ARRAY:



The following is intended to be read by all attendees so that they understand their role and responsibility within this evening's discussion.

This symposium seeks to present histories and narratives of past and contemporary radical struggles centred around Northern Ireland and the island of Ireland so that we may come together and question our own responsibility for its future.

To create a generous, collaborative space for this to happen we ask all present to consider the following and be mindful of our requests.

We agree to consider how much space (both verbal and physical) we are taking up at this event and if our contributions work against a spirit of generosity then we must prioritise other less self-serving speakers.

We agree not to make assumptions or judgements about the lives or backgrounds of anyone we meet here, or any other part of who a person is. Through sharing experiences we are here to actively learn together.

We have a zero tolerance policy for transphobia, racism, homophobia, classism, ableism, and body shaming and understand that this needs to be regularly repeated aloud.

We agree that debate and discussion are not the same thing as abusive or intimidating behaviour, and that we have the right to be treated with dignity and respect whilst speaking.

We all have the right to say 'I don't know'.

We ask everyone to please respect the space that Jerwood have provided and its staff who have given their time and support to allow this event to happen.









Most of the work displayed on the walls have been made in the last 5-10 years by the current local studio artists




The heart of the exhibition is a **physical and digital** archive

This includes 4000+ works by nuerodivergent artists and makers from 2 decades

This embodies a visible trace of people who are often hidden from the world





This film + sound is an edited collection of footage from previous film work (*Tessellate, Modus Operandi, Illuminating the Wilderness*)

The film cuts between the Project Art Works studio in Hastings + an expedition to Affric in Scotland

It shows the artists making work in a familiar place and their investigations of a remote glen, an unfamiliar place in the Scottish Highlands

We see the individuals, families, support teams + artists which form this collective



This studio is set up for making work, having conversations + collaborative and independent practice by artists who benefit from supported environments;

so that they can represent themselves within the exhibition

Becoming CLIMAVORE is a UK-wide collective action museums are replacing farmed salmon with CLIMAVORE alternatives on menus of their cafes and restaurants



A 12 postcard mosaic has been distributed across participating institutions

Visitors can taste the dishes + collect them



Cooking sections use food as a way to watch + intervene in systems of food production

Questioning the impact of food habits on climate change, they propose we eat as CLIMAVORES (rather than herbivores or carnivores) as a form of eating that adapts to the climate



This guide is as much an artwork as it is an essential tool for sharing the arts with wider audiences

The fact is, these are not available as a provision in arts + culture spaces
This guide is not exclusive to neurominority access- visual information can support all audiences and has the power to reach those experiencing barriers in these communal spaces

During this guides research phase, I discovered there is no symbol to help support and alert people who experience photosensitive seizures

With the support of artist Susan Aldworth & The Epilepsy Society I have created a symbol to begin a standard of how we notify our audiences in the creative industries
